Volunteering on a World Renew DRS Reconstruction Site

INDIVIDUALS

I am 18 or over, and I would like to volunteer by myself, with my spouse, or with a friend on a DRS-managed reconstruction site this summer.

Where would I volunteer this summer?

World Renew has openings for summer volunteers on DRS-managed reconstruction sites in Ocean County, New Jersey, or High River, Alberta.

How long would I volunteer for?

A two-week assignment is typical in the summer, but if you have one week free, that works!

Who would I volunteer with?

You will work alongside other Christian adults from across the United States and Canada. Some volunteers are new, and others will have more experience. Either way, you are sure to enjoy the fellowship and have a great time doing it.

Do I need to have reconstruction skills?

Experience is helpful, but not needed. Each team is put together by World Renew DRS so that there is a balance of skills and expertise.

How much does it cost?

Food and lodging are provided. Some of your travel costs may be reimbursed.

What kinds of meals and lodging can I expect?

Your meals are prepared for you during the work week by a team of volunteer cooks at each DRS-managed work site. Bedrooms are provided.

GROUPS

Our church would like to organize a week-long mission trip.

When and where can we go?

There are many locations for groups to choose from. World Renew DRS can schedule just about any size group, with any skill level, at any time of the year.

What are the accommodations like?

Your accommodations vary from site to site. You may have air mattresses on a gym floor and a kitchen to prepare your own meals, or beds and meals may be provided.

How much does it cost?

Your group is responsible for food and travel costs as well as a small donation if it's requested by the local organization providing housing and work.

Is there an age limit?

Age limits are set by the partner organizations, but they generally accommodate high school age and up. Some partners may make accommodations for younger children as long as a parent or guardian is accompanying them.

How does this volunteer opportunity differ from a "World Renew DRS-managed reconstruction site" mentioned in the first column?

World Renew partners with organizations across North America to host church groups on disaster sites. These local organizations provide both housing and work coordination, which allows World Renew to be very flexible in accommodating volunteers of different ages and skill sets, different-sized groups, and different date preferences.
